WHO IS ELIGIBLE? Any staff member who goes beyond the expectations of their job and demonstrates excellence in creating, building and maintaining a nurturing environment is eligible. A staff who champions the vision of the Nurturing Environment program, with language and actions that demonstrate enthusiasm, may be nominated.

WHO CAN NOMINATE? Anyone who receives services from Lexington, their family, and/or any Lexington staff member can nominate someone for recognition.

REWARDING EXCELLENCE All nominations will be recognized at Nurturing Environment Program meetings **October 13-16**—more details TBA. Employees who stand out will be selected for an award. Last year, 200 employees received recognition awards of \$10 to \$250, plus a Certificate of Appreciation and a gift card to the Paul Nigra Center for Creative Arts, totaling over \$7,000.

LEXINGTON'S OWN TERRI SALVIONE NAMED ONE OF FOUR STATEWIDE RECIPIENTS OF THE 2020 THOMAS A. MAUL DIRECT SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL EXCELLENCE AWARD!



The Arc New York has announced the recipients of the Thomas A. Maul Direct Support Professional Award, and we were thrilled to learn that our own Terri Salvione was one of four chosen for this year's award! In honor of her recognition, Terri will receive a commemorative plaque as well as a cash award from The Arc New York in the amount of \$2,500.

Terri has been with Lexington for 16 years, working as a Direct Support Professional in Gloversville Day Hab for two years, then becoming a Direct Support Coordinator (DSC) for Quest II Day Hab in 2008. She worked there until September 1, 2019, when she became a residential DSC for 24 Second Avenue in Gloversville.

In her nomination, we talked about the impact that Terri has had on the people she has supported in the programs where she has worked. A couple of stories in particular demonstrate how Terri has gone above and beyond her DSP responsibilities. The first is how Terri made Taneesh Manion's 40th birthday party the party of Taneesh's dreams, supporting her in all aspects of planning. This included preparing food and decorations on her own time and setting up and prepping everything for the special day. Another story was about a person we support who had lost touch with her children for 30 years. Terri sprang into action to help find them, doing research online and helping set up a Facebook page for the search. When the family members agreed to visit from Florida, Terri picked them up at the airport and escorted them to Lexington, where they were reunited with their mother. The woman unfortunately was in poor health and died a short time later, but this reunion was truly life-altering for her. These are just two of many stories that can be told of Terri Salvione and the passion she has for her work and the people she supports.

The Arc New York, through this award, recognizes individuals who consistently demonstrate excellence, creativity and commitment in providing supports to people who have intellectual and other developmental disabilities. Candidates for this award display an exemplary level of performance over the course of his/her employment at a chapter of The Arc New York and show a commitment to improving the quality of life for people who have disabilities.

Thomas A. Maul, for whom this award is named, was a Commissioner of OPWDD from 1993 to 2006. During his tenure, he addressed many of the longstanding issues that face The Arc New York and the people the organization supports. The Arc New York shared with the Commissioner a major priority – the true recognition of its workforce.

CONGRATULATIONS to Terri Salvione – what an honor it is for her to be chosen for this statewide award! She truly represents the excellence of Lexington's DSPs. And what a testament her winning this award is to ALL of our DSPs! You all rise to the top with her as she is recognized for the quality that our agency brings in the services and programs to the people we support. She is a shining example of what ALL of you do...every single day.

A LOOK AT LEXINGTON'S DIRECT SUPPORT PROFESSIONALS

There are currently 1,008 Direct Support Professionals at Lexington, including those who work for Day Hab, Residential, Transitions, Clinical, Family, Employment and Support Services in Albany and Fulton Counties. Your years of service range from 44+ years (Sharon Diefendorf), 41+ years (Lori Collado) and 41 years (Tim Carver) to seven Relief Pool and four Mentor Staff members who celebrated their first day at Lexington on September 10. Together, our DSPs have amassed an amazing 8,050 years and 82 days of service supporting people with developmental disabilities!!!

YEARS OF SERVICE BREAKDOWN:

- 3 of our DSPs have over 40 years of service
- 26 have 30-40 years of service
- 39 have 25-29 years of service
- 47 have 20-24 years of service

- 92 have 15-19 years of service
- 96 have 10-14 years of service
- 153 have 5-9 years of service
- 552 have 1 day to 4 years of service

We are so proud that nearly half of all of our DSPs have been with Lexington for more than five years, reflecting their long-term commitment to the people we support!
