### COVID-19 Paid Emergency Leave Ending



The New York State COVID-19 Paid Emergency Leave Law will expire on July 31, 2025. After this date, employers will no longer be required to provide paid leave specifically for COVID-19 quarantines or isolation.

### What this means for you:

Starting August 1, 2025, if you need time off due to COVID-19, you'll need to use other available leave options, such as New York State Paid Sick Leave.

In serious cases, other leave protections like FMLA, ADA or state human rights laws may still apply.

# Stay Safe: Injury Prevention Tips

Check out these important injury prevention tips, highlighting some of our most recent safety concerns.

Ensure adjustable beds (beds that adjust height up and down) are not pinching, rubbing or hitting any cord plugged into an electrical outlet.

If the bed is doing any of the things mentioned above, please determine if the cord can be moved to another outlet where this will not occur. If you unable to move it, reach out to the Safety Department for further guidance.

✓ When planning an outing, plan ahead to have a safe and enjoyable day.

If a person uses a wheelchair or other assistive equipment, on an as-needed basis, take the equipment with you on the outing just in case. Enjoy the journey together with the safety of people we support and the staff accompanying them in mind.

Avoid injuries by being aware of your surroundings, especially when in tight spaces.

Take care of yourself so you can continue to care for others.

✓ When assisting with a transfer or mobility technique that is unsafe and could result in injury to yourself, co-workers or someone we support, immediately stop what you're doing and notify your supervisors and the Physical Therapy Department.

Don't forget to submit your concern in Therap.
